## REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Students registering for King George Public Schools must attend the school zoned for their residence. Parents should register at that school and present the following information:

- Child's birth certificate
- Child's Social Security Card
- Child's immunization Record
- Proof of residence

No student shall be admitted to any VA public school unless the parent can furnish an up-to-date physical and shot record. This must be done before a student can start school in August.

- Immunization requirements
- Immunization Certificate Form
- Document of Physical Examination

## KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

To enroll in Kindergarten in the state of Virginia, children must be the 5 years old by Sept. 30 of the current school year. All children entering Kindergarten will be expected to participate in a pre-kindergarten screening of hearing, fine motor skills and general readiness for kindergarten. Appointments for the screening will be made during registration. Screening information is used to plan additional programs and services for kindergarten students. Students are not denied entrance on the basis of screening results.

## PRE-K REGISTRATION

King George County Preschool Programs is located at the Early Childhood Center Old King George Elementary School. The address is 9100 St. Anthony's Road, PO BOX 1239 King George, VA 22485. The program consists of the Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) and the Virginia Preschool Initiative (VPI).
